

DEVILS ISLE HARBORMASTER DUTIES

1. Harbormaster duties are from Friday through Sunday and you should plan to arrive as early as possible on Friday to police up the Island before the arrival of member boats.
2. The new electrical hookup to boat generators is on the dock side end of the north ramp. **Do not start the water pump until you have opened a hose faucet, due to possible excessive water pressure in the PVC water pipe.**
3. Wash down the decks, walkways, tables, benches, walls, and chairs (stored in shed). Set up chairs.
4. Raise the flag and the DI Burgee at 0800 each morning and lower them at sunset each evening. The flags are located in a box on the back of the rail next to the start of the dog run.
5. Aid in the docking of all boats. Placement of boats is skipper's choice. However, no boats over 35 ft. are allowed in the fingers to avoid excessive strain and physical damage to the docks. This applies to visiting clubs as well. Leave 8 ft. of open space at both ends of the swim platform.
6. Generator hours of operation are from 0800 to 2200 (10:00) unless otherwise agreed on by all boats.
7. Monitor good safety practices: No running on decks, docks, walkways, or climbing trees or on the roofs over the decks.
8. It is required that children under 10 must wear an approved PFD at all times while on the docks, decks, walkways, and while swimming.
9. No tie up of dinghies to the swim platform, kayaks are OK, except during swimming.
10. All boats visiting the Island must sign in at the log desk on the main deck at the north end.
11. Collect the docking fees from any guest boats of members prior to their departure.
12. Before leaving Sunday police up the Island, put away the hose, chairs and other items. Make sure the trash goes with you or other members. Take the log sheet and mail it to the island treasurer.
13. There is no docking charge for a members second boat, run-about, ski boat, dinghy, PWC etc. However, a member's main cruising boat has space and location priority and these second boats may have to be moved and tied up behind the dock on the south end on crowded weekends.
14. The discharge of untreated human waste is prohibited! All member's boats, guest boat and visiting club boats are required to have, use and maintain approved marine heads and/or holding tanks/porta-potties while visiting the island.
15. Pets are welcome at DI, but please use the dog run at the north end of the Island for them to do their business and clean up after them. Pets are required to be on leashes on the docks, docks, and walkways.
16. Caution - the walkway going west beyond the equipment shed is closed and not maintained. It is dangerous and is not to be used.
17. If you encounter trespassers just asking them to leave usually works. However, if a problem occurs and cannot be handled by you or other Island members contact the San Joaquin Sheriff at: 209-468-4400.

ADDITIONAL DUTIES FOR VISITING CLUBS

1. The Island may be used by visiting clubs on some weekends during June, July, August, and September on dates selected in advance each year by the Board of Directors. If you are Harbormaster for one of these weekends the DI harbormaster or vice chair will confirm with you the identity of the visiting clubs cruise director and phone number. You will need to contact them and verify their expected arrival time and number of boats. Inform them that you will be standing by on CH 72 and will assist with docking.
2. Before the club's departure you will need to collect one check with the appropriate fees from the visiting club's cruise director. The club will have paid in advance a non- refundable fee of \$200 which is the minimum charge for use of the Island and covers 8 boats for one night. You will need to collect the balance at \$25 per boat per night. Please mail the check to the island treasurer.
3. To prepare the Island you will need to arrive two to three hours in advance of the visiting club. Please make sure they take their trash with them. We have no trash pick up.

5. All these Duties as well as the Isle Rules apply to visiting clubs as well as members and guest boats.
